

# The Alchemist's Hourglass: Restoring Time

(Year 7 - Ages 12-13)

**Mission Briefing:** An Alchemist understands that the most precious element in the universe isn't gold—it's Time. Today, you will map your own future to understand the value of time. Then, you will investigate what happens when that time freezes, and how a Donor has the power to unfreeze it.

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Part 2: The Frozen Map (Case Study)

- Reality: Sam is in the ICU. He is attached to a machine that pumps his heart for him. He cannot leave his room. He cannot go to school. He cannot play soccer (his passion). He is waiting for a donor heart.

Task: Compare your map to Sam's "Frozen Map."

Category	Your Reality	Sam's Reality (Waiting List)

Movement	I can run, walk, and play sports.	
Planning	I can plan for next year's holiday.	

The Hourglass: If Sam does not get a donor heart, his sand will run out. If he does get a donor heart, what happens to his "Future Map"?
