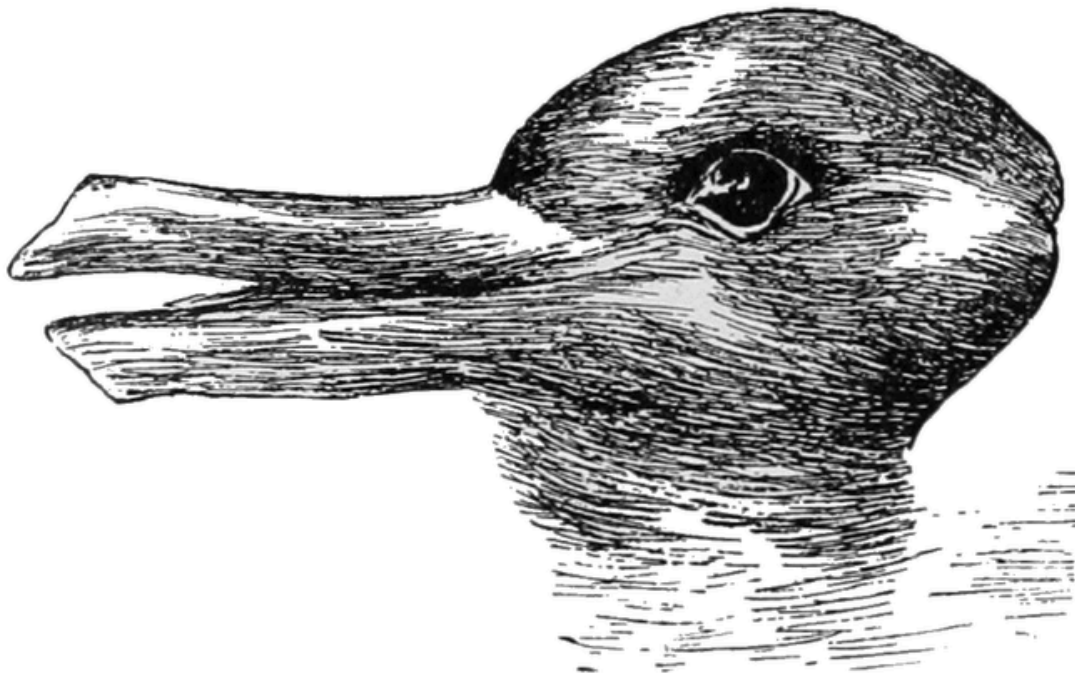
OPTICAL ILLUSION OPTIONS

Option A: Duck/Rabbit Illusion

Description for teachers: A famous ambiguous image that can be seen as either a duck (looking left) or a rabbit (looking right). Perfect for demonstrating how the same image can be interpreted in two valid ways.
