Mission: To investigate the meaning of Legacy and write a respectful, anonymous letter of gratitude to the Donor Family.

Activity 1: The Legacy Log

Task: We learned that Legacy is the lasting good a person leaves behind. Listen to "The Legacy Story" (the Donor Family's story) and complete the log below, focusing on the complex emotions involved in their decision.

Investigation Log	Notes from the Story
THE FAMILY'S GRIEF	What did the family lose? (What emotion is the core of their sadness?)
THE FAMILY'S COMFORT	What decision did the family make to help them feel pride and peace? (Honouring the)
THE LEGACY	What is the lasting, positive impact (Legacy) their loved one created?



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Activity 2: The Two Core Emotions

Task: A Donor Family experiences two strong emotions at the same time: Grief (sadness over loss) and Pride/Comfort (joy from the Legacy). This is complex, but brave.

Grief vs. Comfort: How does the act of honouring the Ethical Pledge (the conversation) help the family choose comfort over guilt or uncertainty?

The Scale of Pride: The donor saved up to seven lives and transformed many more. How does the sheer scale of this heroic impact become a source of Legacy and Pride for the family?

Activity 3: The Anonymous Gratitude Letter

Task: As a Legacy Writer, your job is to craft an anonymous letter of gratitude that celebrates the donor's courage and the family's comfort.

Safety Rules for Writing:

- DO NOT ask personal details about the donor.
 - DO NOT share personal details about yourself (the recipient/student).
 - FOCUS 100% on celebrating the Legacy and kindness of the donor's decision.
