Part 1: The Prediction Lab (Data Synthesis)

Look back at the problems we studied. How were they solved by 2050?

The 2024 Problem	The 2050 Solution (Prediction)
The Shortage: 1,800 people on the waiting list.	e.g., 3D Bioprinters engage! Waiting list is zero.
The Consent Gap: Only 40% of families said "Yes" if they didn't talk.	e.g., The "Conversation" became a normal rite of passage. Consent is now 95%.
The Logistics: Organs died after 4 hours on ice.	e.g., Drones and Perfusion machines move organs instantly anywhere.
