Our Kindness Celebration: A Ripple of a Song

(Year 1 - Ages 6-7):

Lesson 9 of 9

Lesson Summary

This final, celebratory lesson brings the entire unit to a joyful conclusion. Students will review their journey of learning about the "ripple effect of kindness" and will celebrate by learning a special, memorable song that consolidates the key messages of the unit. To honour their role as "Kindness Ambassadors," they will create and receive their own official certificate, celebrating their new understanding of empathy, helping, and the gift of donation.

Learning Intentions

Students will

- Remember and celebrate the key ideas we have learned about kindness.
- Learn and sing a song that tells the story of the "kindness ripple."
- Create a special certificate to celebrate becoming a "Kindness Ambassador."

Success Criteria

Students can

- Sing the "Kindness Ripple" song with my class.
- Name one important idea I learned about helping others.
- Decorate my "Kindness Ambassador" certificate with pride



Resources Required

- A large chart with the lyrics and simple picture icons for the "Kindness Ripple" song.
- An upbeat, simple backing track or a small instrument (like a ukulele or guitar) to accompany the song.
- A pre-printed "Kindness Ambassador" certificate for each student.
- "Special" craft supplies for decorating the certificates: gold and silver markers, shiny stickers, etc.
- A picture book about celebrating success or finishing a journey (e.g., Oh, the Places You'll Go! by Dr. Seuss).

- Singing and Rhythm
- Fine motor skills
- Self-esteem and Pride

Teacher Preparation

- Prepare the song chart with lyrics and picture cues.
- Print the "Kindness Ambassador" certificates.
- This final lesson is a celebration. The tone should be joyful, proud, and full of positive reinforcement. It's a chance to praise the students for their wonderful journey of learning about kindness and to leave them with a lasting, happy memory of the unit.

Additional Information

This lesson has been created as part of <u>Donate Buddies</u>, a program designed to help young children explore kindness, sharing, and the importance of helping others. By introducing these concepts in a fun, age-appropriate, and engaging way, children begin to understand the power of kindness and how their actions can make a big difference.

Organ, eye, and tissue donation is a real-life example of this kindness, where one person can help save the lives of many others. While most people can donate tissue, only a small number of people who pass away in hospitals can become organ donors. One organ donor alone can save up to seven lives and help many more people through eye and tissue donation.
