## **THE LEGACY STORY** **"The Gift They Could Still Give"**

When the Patel family talk about their son, Arjun, they always describe him the same way: bright, energetic, and someone who found joy in helping others. He was the kind of person who held doors open, checked on friends, and never missed a chance to make someone feel included.
