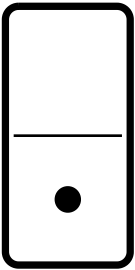


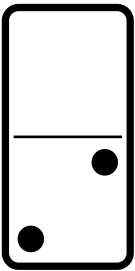
# The Domino Chain Reaction

A simple visual diagram showing how one act of kindness spreads outward.



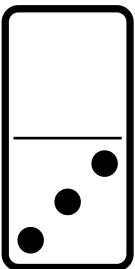
## **DONOR – “The First Domino”**

The very first domino falls when a donor and their family honour the Hero’s Echo. Their kindness sets the entire chain in motion by sharing the Treasures that help others live well.



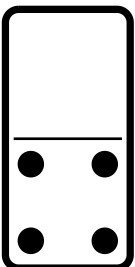
## **RECIPIENT**

The next domino belongs to the person whose life changes in a big way. Sight becomes clear again, movement returns, or health is restored – giving them precious time and freedom back.



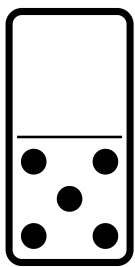
## **THE INNER CIRCLE**

When the recipient improves, their family feels the impact immediately. Worry eases, routines normalise, and joyful moments return. They get to enjoy life together again.



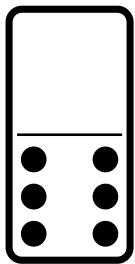
## **THE SUPPORT TEAM**

Doctors, nurses, and coordinators form the next domino. Seeing a successful outcome brings them pride, relief, and a deep sense of purpose.



## **THE WIDER COMMUNITY**

Friends, classmates, teammates, and neighbours all feel the ripple. They welcome back someone they care about and enjoy their energy, humour, and participation again.



## **THE FUTURE**

The final domino represents those still waiting. Every successful transplant gives them renewed hope that their own turn – their own falling domino – is getting closer.



# The Domino Chain Reaction

<b>DOMINO</b>	<b>WHO IS IMPACTED (The Audience)?</b>	<b>WHAT IS THE POSITIVE EFFECT? (Joy, Hope, Life)</b>
1. The Hero's Choice	The Donor and their Family who honor the Hero's Echo.	They start the chain reaction by providing the Treasures of Life (organs/tissues).
2. The Recipient	The person who receives the Treasure of Life.	Their health and Treasure of Time are restored. They can run/see/live again.
3. The Inner Circle	The Recipient's Parents / Family (e.g., siblings).	They stop worrying. They get their loved one back and can enjoy family life together.
4. The Support Team	The Doctors, Nurses, and Transplant Coordinators.	They feel joy and hope because their hard work saved a life. The mission was successful.
5. The Wider Community	The Recipient's Friends, Classmates, or Team (e.g., soccer team).	They get their friend back! They benefit from the recipient's energy, participation, and presence.
6. The Future	People still waiting on the Wait List (The ultimate audience)	The successful transplant gives them new hope that their own domino will fall soon.
