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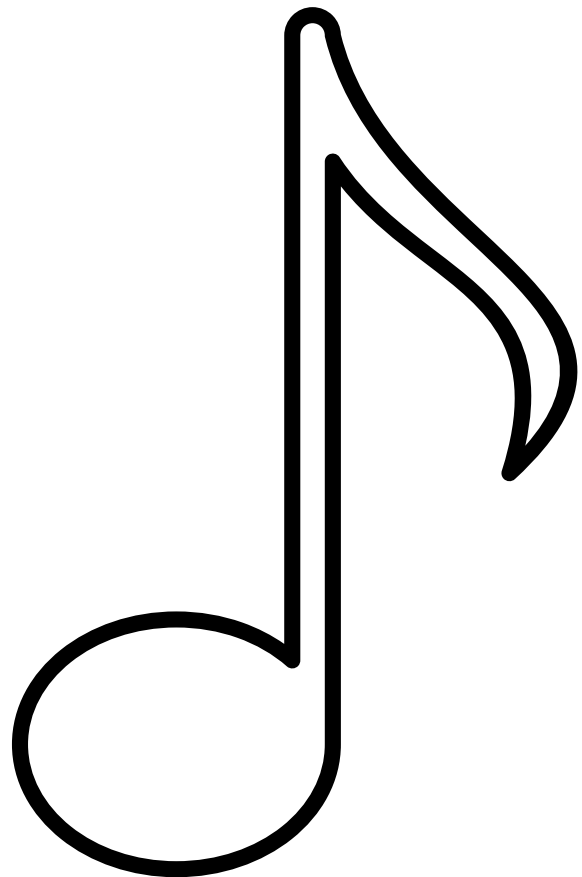
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## Activity 2: Our Hero's Anthem (Class Activity)
